Phillip Eugene Lyness, son of Willard Lyness and grandson of John Lyness, died at age 90, July 5, 2013, at Lincoln, Nebraska, from causes incident to age. He was born August 29, 1922 in Lincoln to Willard E. and Edna Rawlings Lyness.

Philip enjoyed his growing up years on the University of Nebraska Agronomy Experimental Farm with his brother Warren and sisters Phyllis (his twin) and Marilyn. He graduated from Bethany High School (Lincoln). During WWII he was a B-24 bomber pilot in the South Pacific.

Philip married Ruth Ann Finkle in 1949, and they raised five children – Susan, Jeffery, Scott, Melinda, and Peter. The family was raised in Minnesota, Iowa, Illinois, Texas, and Lincoln, Nebraska. Living Lyness Males

Several of us have been curious about the number of living males whose last name is Lyness, because they have the ability to pass the Lyness name on. We have lost track of some branches of the family, but this article tracks the ones who are known (and directly related). We start with Joseph Hargitt Lyness as generation zero. Joseph died in 1874, leaving two sons.

Generation one consists of Joseph's two sons, Enoch (died 1903) and Joseph Hargitt, Junior (died 1910).

Generation two consists of Enoch's sons, George Wesley, John Joseph, Henry, Albert, Frank, and Walter, and Joseph's sons John Randolph and George William. All have died.

Generation three gets more extensive. George Wesley had Arthur, Albert, and Fred. John Joseph had Charles Enoch, Herbert, Willard, Edwin, John Howard, and George Ernest. Henry had John Henry. Albert, Frank, and Walter might have had sons, but we don't have a record of them. John Randolph had Harry Randolph. George William had Paul and Frank Alton. To the best of your editor's knowledge, all in generation three have died.

So we have 17 known living in generation five, and one who very likely is living.
