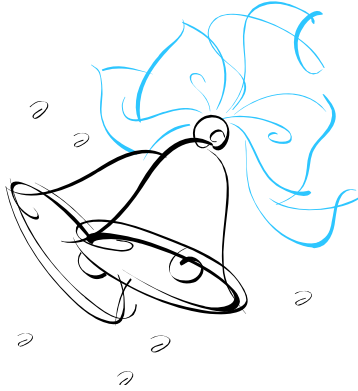
Births
